



You have selected activities for primary aged pupils. Below you will find quick activities to accompany our in depth lesson plan to support the theme of 'Let's Create a Better Internet Together'.

1. Let's Create a Better Internet Together

Design and create a **slogan** to reflect the message of the day; *let's create a better internet together*. You can use the template in Appendix 1 to help. Whether you design on paper or digitally, why not display these around your classroom, along your school corridor or on your school website? If you have a school Twitter account, why not tweet them including **@Childnet #SID2015** and we will share them with our followers!

2. Paper People Pledges

Print out our **paper people** (Appendix 2a), decorate and colour in and write an oath or digital promise on the placard or speech bubble (Appendix 2b). This should be a positive pledge to reflect what they will do to create a better internet. Join these paper people to create a whole class or school display.

3. Recipe for a Better Internet

What key points would you use as your main ingredients to create your perfect **"better internet" recipe**? Support your recipe with pictures to make it clear and visual. You can use the templates in **Appendices 3a** and **3b** to help. One of our winning entries from this year's Childnet Film Competition did just that! This could also be created on a vlog, as a YouTube tutorial or shared with other classes in the school.

4. Choice Wheel

How to play:

- Print out the wheel (Appendix 4a) and in pairs, ask your pupils to colour in each section.
- Assemble the arrow using a paper fastener.
- Read out the digital dilemmas (Appendix 4b) and invite pupils to move the arrow to find a solution that could help solve the problem. Discuss and emphasise that there may be more than one positive action that could work.

For a quicker option, project/show the Choice Wheel in Appendix 4c on the whiteboard in your classroom and run as a discussion exercise. Alternatively print out the choice posters in Appendix 4d and place them around the classroom then ask pupils to stand next to their choice.

5. My Online Pledge

Ask your pupils what promise they could make to help create a better internet:

'To help make the internet a better place, I promise I will...'

Once your pupils have decided and written their pledge, take pictures (or film them) holding up their pledge or advice on the template provided (Appendix 5). Create a digital photo or film montage and screen on your school website!


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


